Scholarship funds will be distributed on a first come first serve basis to eligible preschool providers. 4. If a preschool receives notice of award of other federal, state or local funding support for preschool services after entering into a contract with BooSt Together for Children ECI Area Board, the provider must notify the ECI Coordinator immediately and the contract funding award will be renegotiated. 5. Funded providers are to invoice for services monthly. 6. Demonstrate a commitment and ability to comply with all relevant state and federal laws, including all rules and policies associated with this request for funding. 7. Scholarship funds will be distributed on a first come first serve basis to eligible preschool providers. 8. If a preschool receives notice of award of other federal, state or local funding support for preschool services after entering into a contract with BooSt Together for Children ECI Area Board, the provider must notify the ECI Coordinator immediately and the contract funding award will be renegotiated. 9. Funded providers are to invoice for services monthly. One-half day is the maximum amount allowed for preschool tuition assistance for 4 year olds receiving State funding. Pull Day funding for 3 year-old's may be possible if funds remain available after all applications are processed. If funding is not available applications will be funded on a first come first serve basis at the half day rate. Preschools shall have a cap of \$245.00 for nine months maximum even if tuition is over the \$245.00 maximum amount.
